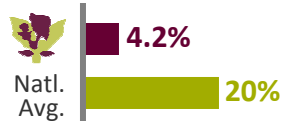


Enable Healthy Families

54 participants in our workforce development program were placed in permanent jobs



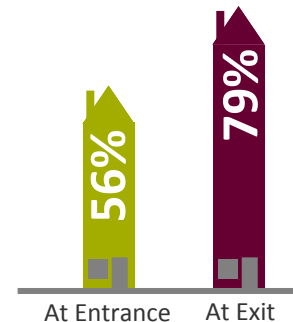
76% remained employed for at least one year⁴

Community Impact

We employed **56** participants in transitional jobs at our social enterprise, Bright Endeavors—paying more than **\$150,000** in wages, and creating over \$12,000 in tax revenue for the Garfield Park community last year.
